Describe a noisy place you have been to?

VOCABULARY

attract (verb) - if you are attracted by something, it interests you and makes you want it

bark (verb) - when a dog barks, it makes a short, loud sound

calm (adjective) - not excited, nervous or upset

croaking (verb) - to make a rough low sound, like the sound a frog makes

crowd (noun) - a large number of people gathered together in a public place, for example in the streets or at a sports game

engaged (adjective) - busy doing something; involved with somebody/something in an active and interested way

explode (verb) - to burst, break apart or make something burst loudly and violently, causing damage

firecracker (noun) - a small firework that explodes with a loud noise

gap (noun) - a space where something is missing

initially (adverb) - at the beginning

overloaded (verb) - to put too great a load on something, to give somebody too much of something

pricier (adjective) - more expensive

queue (noun) - a line of people, cars, etc. waiting for something or to do something

rock music (noun) - a type of loud popular music, developed in the 1960s, with a strong beat played on electric guitars and drums

rooster (noun) - an adult male chicken

sense (noun) - an understanding about something, an ability to judge something

shockingly (adverb) - in a way that offends or upsets people, in a way that is morally wrong

tradition (noun) - a belief, custom or way of doing something that has existed for a long time among a particular group of people; a set of these beliefs or customs

trendy (adjective) - very fashionable

unexpectedly (adjective) - in a way that surprises you because you were not expecting it
